West Hartford Setting a "Fine" Example

Roy Ryzak of the West Hartford Police Department was kind enough to offer clarification on the town's Alarm Ordinance.

An *Alarm Registration* is an initial form to be completed by the property owner advising the AHJ that an

alarm has been installed at the location. An *Alarm Permit Application* is required when upgrading your alarm system.

Additionally, West Hartford provides its residents with a six month learning curve if these forms are

completed, an alarm is activated, the authorities are dispatched and the disposition is human error. During this period, no fees are assessed for false dispatches. "It's basically a get out of jail free card", states Ryzak.

According to the national Electronic Security Association (ESA), nine out of ten intruders said they would avoid a home that had an alarm system in place. Don't be fooled, however, they know a phony decal/yard sign when they see one.



What You Should Know About Carbon Monoxide and Automated Detection



According to the Journal of the American Medical Association, carbon monoxide is the number one cause of poisoning deaths.

You may be exposed to unsafe levels of CO as the result of:

- Using poorly maintained or unvented heating equipment
- Running vehicles in garages or other enclosed spaces
- Using a gas stove or oven to heat the home
- Leaving chimneys clogged or blocking heating exhaust vents
- Running generators or gas-powered tools in enclosed areas or near windows, doors, or vents
- Using a propane camp stove, heater, or light inside your home or enclosed area
- Engaging in activities near boat engine exhaust
- Poor ventilation during the use of a kerosene space heater, always follow instructions and safety precautions.

CO poisoning doesn't just occur in the home. The following occupations present higher risks for CO poisoning:


CO detectors monitored by our central station have the lowest current draw (20mA) in the market today and provide peace of mind by including an extra level of protection for situations when:

- The residence is empty or residents are sleeping
- Pets, children and elderly are alone
- Residents are already suffering effects from CO exposure
- A problem arises with the detector
- Employees are exposed to unsafe CO levels in their place of business.

If CO concentration hits dangerous levels, our central station will alert our client that the detector:

- Has been tampered with
- Is experiencing mechanical trouble
- Is in end-of-life (The detectors we install are equipped with a six-year end-of-life notification system that alerts the central station at the end of each detector's functional life span.)
